Diana Lowe, QC is the Executive Director of the Canadian Forum on Civil Justice. Diana holds Bachelors and Masters degrees in Law (LLB, University of Alberta, 1984) (LLM, University of Edinburgh, 1991) and practised law for 13 years, first in Alberta and more recently in British Columbia. Her legal practice included litigation and administrative law; law reform; writing; editing; and teaching the public, lay advocates, law students and lawyers. In January 2008 she was appointed Queen's Counsel.

Since October 1998 she has focused her energies on the Canadian Forum on Civil Justice, which is a non-profit, independent, national organization established to help meet the challenges of modernizing our civil justice systems in Canada.
